As the first Big Hearts trip recipient of 2024, Maddy Bezdicek, accompanied by her parents, Bryan and Jami, and her brother Garrett on a 6-day Big Hearts under the Big Sky adventure with MOGA outfitter members Triple J Ranch in Augusta, MT.

Maddy was 17 when she was first diagnosed with an extremely rare form of liver cancer, and for the next two years she would be in and out of hospitals across the country for tests, chemo treatments, ultimately a full liver transplant in March of 2023, hospitalized recovery and more testing and chemo treatments. During this difficult period, Maddy relied on her Faith, love of the family, and her warrior spirit to see her and the family through these challenging times. A favorite verse of hers and one she draws strength from is Matthew 28:20 "Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

Maddy and her family had been nominated for the Big Hearts trip when she was 17, but it would be two long years, and many trips in and out of hospitals, before she was able to take the trip. Drawing from the family's interest in all things outdoors, their trip centered around horseback riding (Maddy connected with a large soral, Rooster, and rode him every day), fly fishing, trap shooting and travels along the Sun River. MOGA members Kim and Ernie Barker with Triple J Ranch hosted the trip and provided a great experience. Some of the best moments came around the campfire while enjoying summer evenings along the Sun River.

Hailing from Arkansas, SSG Wright, 44, served as a combat medic for nine years, deploying multiple times during the Global War on Terror. Throughout his career, he provided vital medical support under intense conditions, ensuring the well-being of fellow soldiers in combat zones. After sixteen years, he retired with a medical discharge due to injuries

sustained in service. His commendable record notably includes a Purple Heart for wounds received in combat and the Army Commendation Medal with Valor, awarded for his bravery in the line of duty. Chris remains active in the veteran community, participating in service organizations and youth programs. He continues to inspire others with his resilience and dedication.

#### **SGM Charles "Chuck" Ritter**



SGM Ritter has dedicated over two decades of his life to the U.S. Army, enlisting in 1998 as a light infantryman. His commitment led him to pass the rigorous Army Special Forces Assessment and Selection in 2001, launching a prestigious career within the elite 3rd Special Forces Group (Airborne). SGM Ritter's career is marked by extensive experience,

having deployed seventeen times, with twelve deployments involving combat operations. His valor and service have been recognized through numerous commendations, including the Silver Star Medal, Bronze Star for Valor, and an Army Commendation Medal for Valor. Additionally, he has

earned three Purple Heart Medals among many other military honors.

SGM Ritter joined the Big Hearts family this October along with his wife Ines and son Ben, for a 5-Day Guided Elk Hunt, a visit to Chico Hot Springs, fishing, horseback riding and shooting clays at the ranch. They also enjoyed a day exploring Yellowstone National Park.


JJJ Wilderness Ranch was a new contributor for Big Hearts this year hosting the Bezdicek family in July. Located in Augusta, Montana with

### Volunteer Spotlight: Capital High School



2025 will mark the 11th year of collaboration between Capital High School and Big Hearts. The partner-ship started in 2015, when Capital High's welding and machining students made 15 custom fly rods to pre-

sent to Big Hearts trip recipients. The students' work not only gave them an opportunity to practice their fabrication skills, but allowed deserving individuals to benefit from their efforts.

Nationally-recognized Welding and Machining instructor Jim Weber has cultivated several classes of hardworking and philanthropic students, some of which, that continue to give back to Big Hearts long after graduation. "It's always a win-win," says Weber. "So many of our kids love to hunt and fish, and appreciate the opportunities the outdoors offer. They want to bless other people with the same things they've been blessed with." Since then, the relationship with Capital High has continued to grow and is an essential part of the Big Hearts' mission.





Throughout the years, Weber's students have created everything from knives, signs, and fly rods, to firepits and porch swings. These items are auctioned off at the annual Big Hearts Benefit Auction and bring in thousands of dollars for the organization each year.
